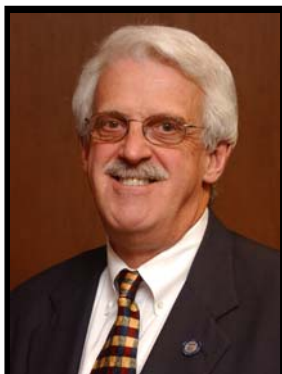




Lewis J. Taylor, PhD
