

New leaders appointed for 2010

The Norfolk Community Services Board has named new leaders for the 2010 year.

The board, which was established more than 40 years ago, works to improve the quality of life for residents with mental health, substance abuse, intellectual disability and infant development problems. It also provides youth services.

This year, Dr. Lewis J. Taylor, a psychologist at Hampton Roads Behavioral Health P.C., will serve as the board's chairman. Taylor has previously volunteered as the group's vice chairman and treasurer.

William Graves, dean of the Darden School of Education at Old Dominion University, will serve as vice chairman. Accountant George Tatterson and mental-health advocate Kathleen Weaver, a registered nurse, will be the group's treasurer and secretary, respectively.

The foursome are some of the 15 members of the Community Services Board. Board members are appointed by the City Council, and serve a term of three years.
